Predator Free Southland



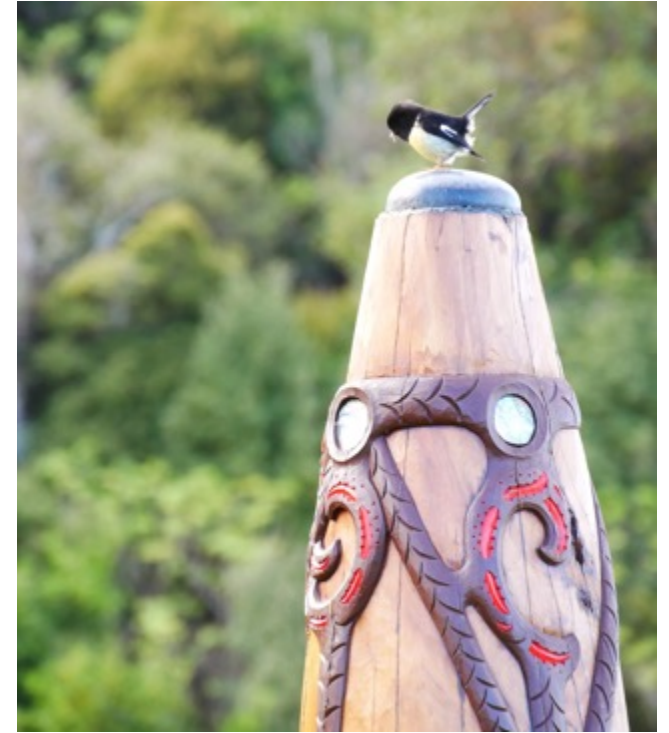
- Bluff Hill Motupōhue Environment Trust formed 2008, 100% volunteer workforce
- Sacred site of cultural significance to Ngāi Tahu whanui
- 200 ha DOC Scenic Reserve
- Removal and sustained suppression of mustelid, rat, feral cat, hedgehog and possums
- Species monitoring – 2 mainland titi colonies
- Species translocation – 2018 South Island robin
- Protect the Bluff Backyard Trapping Project 2020
- Te Korowai Whakahou Native Plant Nursery
- Predator Free Southland Strategy



Predator Free Aotearoa by 2050

- Predator Free Rakiura – feral cats, rats, hedgehogs and possums
- Kākāpō Recovery Programme – 209 birds
- Takahē Recovery Programme – 418 birds
- Whenua Hou Nature Reserve – co-managed by Ngāi Tahu and DOC
- Pest Free Maukahuka Auckland Islands (project paused due to Covid-19)
- Rakiura Titi Island – customary harvest from 36 islands

THE STATE OF OUR NATURE SPECIES

- **4000** classified as in **some trouble**
- **1000** classified as in **serious trouble** and/or facing risk of extinction
- More than **50 bird species** have become **extinct** in the 750 years since human arrival
- **Possums, rats and stoats** – main mammalian predators

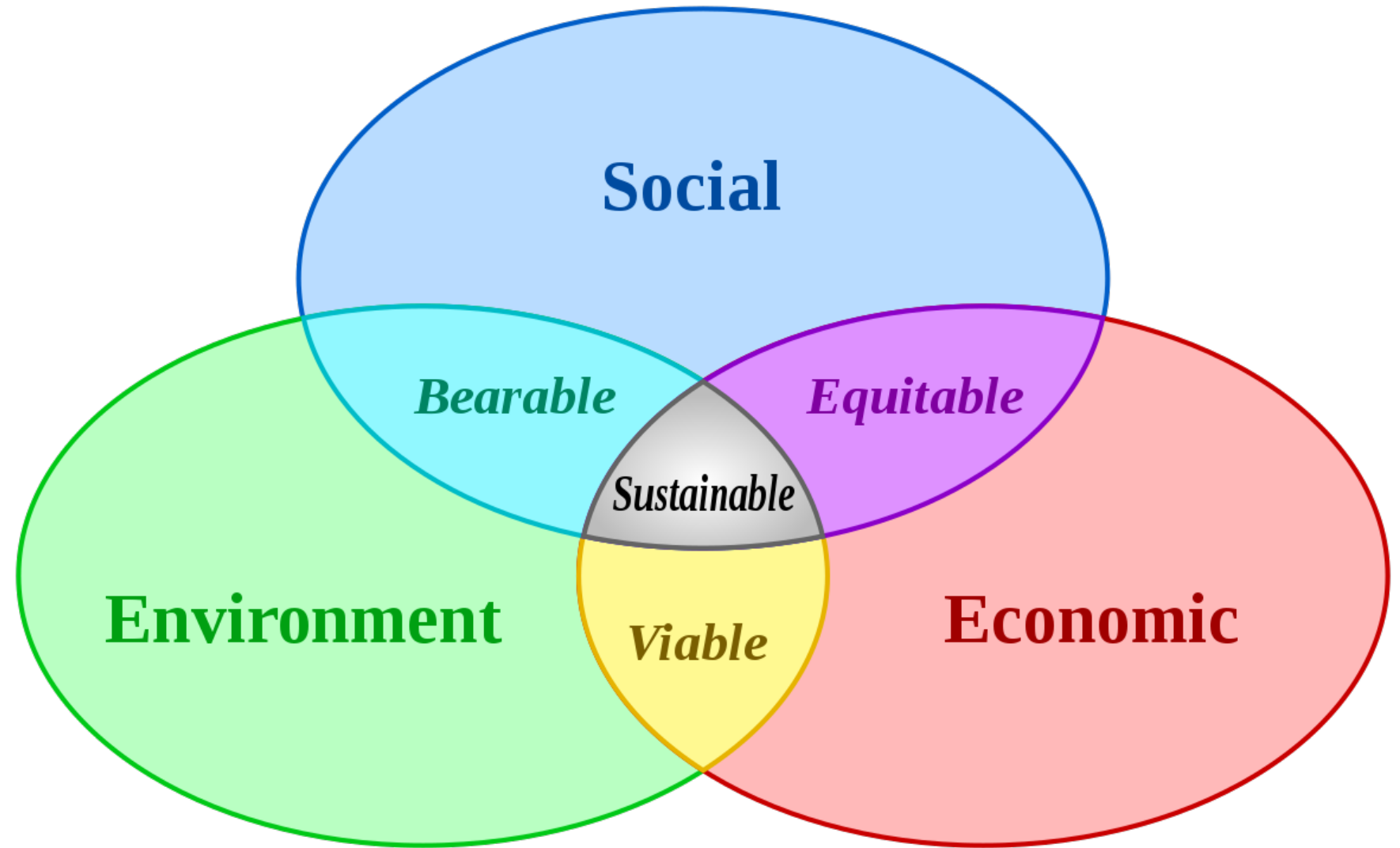
