Micro Credential in Community Led Development Information Sheet 2024

Is the micro credential for me?

If you already work in community development, and you'd like a little qualification to recognise and deepen your work – the answer is YES! This is for me!

You need to be ready to reflect deeply into your practice, while supported by facilitators and the peer group who are working towards this micro credential at the same time as you.

I've attended the Information Session and want to enrol OR I don't need the Info Session I am ready to enrol now – what happens next?

- Register online. As part of your registration you will either pay by credit card or be invoiced for \$649 + GST for local and central government and \$525 + GST for community organisations and volunteer groups. You will also be asked to choose a slot for your first 1:1 meeting with a facilitator.
- Consider your possible case study before your first 1:1, it will be about your current work.
- Talk to others you work with. You can do the micro credential by yourself, or each person in a team

can enrol for their own case study and then support each other during the year.

What are the dates for workshops and 1:1 support sessions?

The four workshops are

1. Wednesday 3 April, 12 – 1.30 pm: Exploring community-led development frameworks. Tools to identify and further develop your critical reflective practice
2. Wednesday 22 May, 12 – 1.30 pm: Unpacking the tasks of the micro-credential as they apply to your case study and your work
3. Wednesday 3 July 12 – 1.30 pm: Sharing progress to date, peer-to-peer feedback and identifying next steps
4. Wednesday 7 August, 12 – 1.30 pm: Getting to success. Critical reflection to support your completion of the qualification tasks

You chose the dates/times for your two 1:1 sessions. These will be Wednesdays, each one within a time window. The first session is 20 minutes and the second is 30 minutes.

How much time is involved in completing the micro credential?

- This is an individual matter; some people suggest a couple of hours a week. But you know you, how you study, and what works best in your life.
- Case study submissions are due 27 September.
- You can submit your case study earlier if that works best for you.

What do I have to do to achieve the micro credential?

- Submit a case study that is guided by the tasks outlined online.
- There are four tasks.
- One task is to get feedback (a form is provided) from two people. 1) a participant in your case study and 2)

one other person who knows enough about your work to complete the questions.
